"The roll cast is not only the beginning caster's security blanket, it but remains an extremely valuable technique throughout every fly fisherman's career. It is best known as the cast to use if you have no room above or behind you for a conventional aerial cast." --Joan Wulff (Joan Wulff's Fly Casting Techniques)

Bill plans to have a shallow water trough in place, so we will have real water tension for this lesson. We will start the lessons at 6:00 pm, so come early if you can, and bring your favorite rod. We will stay outside as long as we have light (natural or artificial).

Bill has attended three classes with Joan Wulff dating back to 1991. He can attest to the value of the training he received to his success over the years. He has put the techniques to use in such locations as Alaska, Belize, British Columbia, and Coastal North Carolina. In addition to being trained by casting expert Joan Wulff.
